



Twist the tail off of the body. Put a fork in the tail upside down between the meat and white underside. Pull the meat out. Take out the black gut running the length of the tail. Pull the body apart from the bottom middle. Separate from the walking legs on either side.

The fried clam was invented in 1916 by Bessie and Lawrence "Chubby" Woodman. Woodman's of Essex still makes this tasty seafood treat the same way.

Enjoy hors d'oeuvres harborside in Salem or Marblehead, or watch the working waterfront from one of Gloucester's multitude of restaurants. Grab a cocktail and freshly shucked oysters on the half shell at the fabulous Beauport Hotel, or feast on overflowing platters of fried seafood at Woodman's of Essex.
